

Coastal Partnership East

The launch of Coastal Partnership East will take place on 10 June 2016. This is an innovative collaboration among North Norfolk District Council, Great Yarmouth Borough Council, Suffolk Coastal District Council and Waveney District Council. The Partnership will work with communities, businesses and organisations along the Norfolk and Suffolk Coast to deliver a combined, efficient and comprehensive coastal management service.

10th Anniversary – RNLI lifeguard service in partnership with NNDC

The RNLI, the charity that saves lives at sea, first teamed up with North Norfolk District Council in 2007 to provide beach patrols at Cromer, Sheringham, Mundesley and Sea Palling. A decade later, the service has expanded along the East Anglia coast to 16 beaches, including at West Runton, East Runton and Wells in North Norfolk, as well as beaches in the Great Yarmouth area and Suffolk.

Having lifeguards on duty when North Norfolk is at its busiest means visitors and residents can have peace of mind while enjoying our beautiful coastline. It should be noted that compulsory purchase will only be used in the last resort as we would prefer to find mutually acceptable solutions with the property owners.
