

NNDC Report from Vincent Fitzpatrick – 12 March 2019

Council Tax: At the last meeting (27/02/2019) of NNDC full council meeting an increase of 3.4% in the District's in the District's element of council tax was voted through. This is an increase of £4.95 for a band D property - giving a charge of £207.62 (£148.77 for the District and £58.85 for parish and town councils). In 2019/20, NNDC will collect £6.2m (NNDC) and £2.4m (town and parish councils)

Enforcement: The owner of a riding establishment has pleaded guilty for taking payment for hiring horses in contravention of the Riding Establishments Act 1964. the owner applied for a licence for the premises in 2018 but was refused on the basis the location lacked the required facilities. Despite the refusal it came to the attention of North Norfolk District Council officers that the establishment continued to operate. At a hearing at Norwich Magistrates on February 21, the owner submitted a guilty plea and was fined £250 and has to pay £750 towards costs plus the £30 victim surcharge.

North Norfolk Business Awards: The second North Norfolk Business Awards were held on 21 February 2019. The awards were organised by North Norfolk District Council and hosted by Chris Sargisson, Chief Executive of Norfolk Chamber of Commerce.
