- The flagpole at District Council offices in Cromer
- Fakenham Parish Church near the Fakenham Connect office

We kindly ask that you refrain from laying cards, teddies, balloons, candles and other miscellaneous offerings with the floral tributes. The floral tributes will be blessed the day after the funeral and then composted. A tributary tree will then be planted in their place.
