Nutrient Neutrality

The council has joined the joint venture company together with Anglian Water, Breckland, South Norfolk & Broadland. It is hoped that progress can be made by late Summer that may release Planning permissions currently effected by the Nutrient Neutrality restrictions.

Refuse Contract

It was agreed on 21st June at full council to purchase two further vehicles. The number of trade waste & Garden Bin collections have increased dramatically and while this is good business for NNDC it has put pressure on the collections rounds. Approximately 3 ½ Tonnes of Batteries & Small electrical devices have been collected since the new service roll out.

Horsey Seals

NNDC has been supporting & liaising with Friends of Horsey Seals and seal rescue centres for some time.

At the 21st June meeting it was unanimously resolved to work towards removing all flying rings from beaches. Amongst a number of actions agreed, retailers will be checked to see if they are still selling flying rings. **Seal of approval certificates** will be presented to businesses that have stopped selling the rings. Signs will be designed and displayed at beaches to discourage holiday makers from using them on the beach.

Council Seeking Land For New Affordable Homes

North Norfolk district council is working with Broadland Housing and Flagship Housing groups to find small and medium sites with the potential to build new affordable homes in the district. The project aims to make the process for potential developers as straightforward as possible. Once built, one of the local housing associations will buy the new homes and let at sub- market rents to households in housing need.
